### Alaska Pipeline Project – Guiding Principles



A key objective of the Alaska Pipeline Project is to achieve positive, long-term relationships with Alaska Native and Canadian Aboriginal groups, organizations, communities and landowners along the project corridor. We believe these relationships will be realized through active communications and engagement as the project progresses.

Successful stakeholder engagement is multifaceted and should be designed to facilitate communication and relationship building. Communication must be transparent, accurate and timely and incorporate two-way dialog on both local and regional levels.

Relationships are developed when parties demonstrate a willingness to openly share information and ideas. The Alaska Pipeline Project understands that this will require on-going communications and relationship building. We will build these relationships by:

- Implementing a long-term and systematic stakeholder engagement program;
- Conducting community meetings along the project corridor, and in local communities and regional hubs to provide information and to hear about local ideas, issues, and concerns;
- Conducting outreach meetings with regional and village corporation leadership, local government representatives, tribal consortia, band and tribal councils and members of the public.

### Our Approach

The Alaska Pipeline Project's approach to achieving positive, long-term relationships involves conducting engagement activities in a meaningful way, which fully supports the spirit of collaboration. We are committed to:

- Providing information in a timely manner;
- Seeking to understand issues and concerns that have been raised;
- Making reasonable efforts to avoid or mitigate expressed concerns or issues;
- Identifying and seeking to fully understand potential adverse impacts;
- Ensuring the scope of any impacts are effectively communicated and mitigation measures are considered.



## Information Sharing

The Alaska Pipeline Project will share many types of information with its stakeholders throughout the engagement process, including:

- Project description and schedules
- Pipeline route and facility locations
- Land access requirements for field programs, pipeline construction and facilities
- Potential effects of the project on the community
- Employment and business opportunities
- Training and educational opportunities
